NUTRITION ONE SUPPLEMENTAL PROGRAM

Nutrition insecurity is a significant national health concern, especially among low-income populations and domestic animals residing within households. Often associated with food insecurity is nutrition insecurity which is characterized by poor nutrition, limited physical activity, and unsafe food practices. So What is Food Insecurity?

For families experiencing food insecurities, feeding their cats and dogs often becomes challenging. An estimated 29 million cats and dogs live with families experiencing food insecurities. Research on human food insecurity has found that people who cannot afford to feed themselves and the high cost of living turn to food pantries. Although many human food pantries exclude cat and dog food, it is important to consider adding dog and cat food to pantries as a supportive aid in their Human distribution.

What are the effects of Human-animal food insecurity? People with animals residing within households experiencing food insecurity often are faced with a series of struggles, such as sharing food obtained from food banks to keep their cat and/or dogs fed, resulting in multiple food bank visits; the harsh decision to surrender their beloved Furry Family members to shelters, where many individuals rely on their cats and dogs for emotional support and companionship, or the most horrendous action of abandoning their cat or dog to the streets to search for food.

RESCUES ON85TH administers The Supplemental Nutrition One Assistance Program (NOSP) which is a community outreach program currently serving Jefferson County, Alabama. The Program's purpose is to assist with food insecurity within the household where cats and dogs reside; provide resources and educational material on the proper care of cats and dogs; provide cat food and/or dog food (occasionally rabbits, horses, birds) and other supplies to help keep cats and dogs in home, assisting in the prevention of surrender and/or abandonment, due to inability to provide nutrition.

We work to improve access to nutritional meals for cats and dogs and in the process freeing up the cost for cat and dog parents to place on other issues such as extra food, supplies, or even utility costs. We singlularly or act in unison with organizations that provide food assistance to households within our community to provide nutritional meals and supplies to households where cats and dogs reside.

How does it work? We provide Walmart and Amazon Registries in order that the community can purchase supplies for families in need, who cannot afford the, We also partner with GOODS sources and manages excess, re-branded, and short-dated food and supplies from donors including manufacturers, distributors, and retailers. The network consists of thousands of charitable partners including animal welfare organizations, food banks, Veteran Affairs locations, and other qualified agencies. The model is similar to a food bank, as goods are donated, but we pay for freight cost, warehouse storage, program costs, and transportation for distribution.

To qualify for assistance, you must be a resident of Jefferson County and at least 18 years of age. You must complete this application in its entirety, bring to distribution site or email the application to us. at info@rescueson85th.org. If you do not have an email address, we will call or text you. Once your application is received, you will receive a confirmation email of the status. The cat or dog must reside within the household and be a official part of that residing family or individuals household. This is a supplemental program and it is not meant to take your responsibility of the car of your Family Member. We do not guarantee specific brands or sizes, as food and supplies are donated in accordance with the donors' distribution. RESCUES ON85TH staff, volunteers, subsides, or partnering agencies cannot benefit from products, programs, or services administered by or through our organization. Donated products are for the sole purpose of RESCUES ON85TH mission and programs. We are strictly a unpaid volunteer organization.

PARVO:WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW


WHAT IS CANINE PARVOVIRUS IN DOGS?

Canine parvovirus (CPV) is a highly contagious viral disease of dogs that commonly causes acute gastrointestinal illness in puppies. The disease most often strikes in pups between six and 20 weeks old, but older animals are sometimes also affected. A rare variant of the disease may be seen in very young (neonatal) puppies is myocarditis (an inflammation of the heart muscle).

PREVENTION FOR DOG FAMS!

Veterinarians usually administer the CPV vaccine as part of a combination shot which includes, among others, the distemper, canine adenovirus, and parainfluenza vaccines. These shots are given every 3 to 4 weeks from the time a puppy is 6 weeks old until he is at least 16 weeks of age. A booster vaccination is recommended one year later, and then at one at three-year intervals thereafter.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF

lethargy, depression, and loss or lack of appetite, followed by a sudden onset of high fever, vomiting, and diarrhea. If your dog is experiencing bouts of bloody diarrhea and/or vomiting, CPV is only one of several potential culprits. Your veterinarian can run several tests to help determine whether your dog is infected with CPV.



WHAT ARE THE TREATMENT OPTIONS?

Treatment options for dogs suffering from CPV involve supportive care and management of symptoms. Treatment options will vary, depending on how sick the dog is, but certain aspects are considered vital for all patients. A hospital stay is often necessary so that the dog can receive intravenous fluids and nutrients to replace the vast quantities lost via vomiting and diarrhea. An intravenous drip is preferred because the digestive tract of stricken dogs is usually in distress and can't tolerate or absorb what the dog needs. Blood transfusions may also be helpful to boost low blood cell counts that may result from CPV infecting the bone marrow.

Antibiotics may be appropriate therapy for a dog suffering from CPV, administered either intravenously or as injections, to help fight the infection if intestinal bacteria have entered the bloodstream. In addition, medications to control nausea and diarrhea are sometimes useful. Many dogs will respond to medical therapy if it is initiated in a timely fashion, and those dogs that recover from CPV infection retain lifelong protective immunity against the strain that infected them.





PREVENTION FOR CAT FAMS!

The most effective way of protecting your cat is by vaccination. Your veterinarian will usually advise you to start vaccination at the age of 8 or 9 weeks. Two or three doses, three to four weeks apart, are recommended. The last of these should not be before the age of 16 weeks. A follow-up dose at 26 to 52 weeks is now recommended. Adult cats can also get the feline parvovirus. You must remember to give the booster doses of the vaccine regularly. Both live and killed vaccines are available and are very effective. If one of your cats has a feline parvovirus infection, they must be isolated from other cats. Their litter box must be cleaned and disinfected regularly. The feline parvovirus can survive in the environment for many months, so you must disinfect your entire home to keep your other pets safe. If your other cats are not vaccinated, they are at a high risk.



HOW IS CAT PARVOVIRUS DIAGNOSED?

Feline parvovirus disease can be difficult to diagnose, as its symptoms vary from mild disease to severe, fatal illness. The illness caused by this virus is also similar to that of a salmonella or campylobacter infection, a feline immunodeficiency virus (FIV) infection, a feline leukemia virus (FeLV) infection, and pancreatitis.

Along with the symptoms, a history of exposure and a lack of vaccination make this disease likely. Your veterinarian will order stool and blood tests to diagnose this disease. The laboratory may identify the virus in your cat's stools. The blood test would show a reduced number of all cell types (pancytopenia), a characteristic of feline parvovirus disease.

WHAT ARE THE TREATMENT OPTIONS?

There are no medicines that can kill this virus. Good supportive care with intravenous fluids, nutrients, and antibiotics to prevent secondary bacterial infection may help your cat survive. Kittens have high mortality rates. Older cats have a better chance of surviving.

WHAT IS FELINE PARVOVIRUS IN

Parvo is a term used for the disease caused by the feline parvovirus. The illness is most common and severe in kittens. At birth, most kittens have antibodies from their mother. These antibodies protect them for the first few weeks. By the age of 4 to 12 weeks, this protection wanes, and the kittens become vulnerable to the virus. Feline parvo is most common in cats 3 to 5 months old. The feline parvovirus is widespread in the environment, and almost all cats are exposed to it. Apart from young kittens, sick cats and unvaccinated cats are most likely to get this disease.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF PARVO?

The feline parvovirus does not always cause symptoms. Some cats have the infection and no visible disease. The usual symptoms of cats sick with the parvovirus are:

- Lethargy and depression
- Frothing at the mouth or vomiting
- Watery discharge from the nose
- Fever in the early stages, followed by a low body temperature
- Diarrhea, which may be watery or bloody
- An inability to eat and drink

The disease can progress in severity and lead to death. Sometimes, a cat may have no symptoms but die suddenly.
